MINUTES OF THE
FEBRUARY 7, 1990 MEETING
OF THE DUPONT CIRCLE ANC

The Dupont Circle ANC (ANC 2B) held a regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday February 7, 1990 at 7:30 p.m. at St. Thomas Parish. All commissioners (Grandis, Moses, Rieffel, Gaugler, Bass, Maggi, and Evans) were present.

The meeting opened with an open forum at which Captain Bruce McDonald of the 2nd District Police presented a report. He was questioned by a member of the public who expressed dissatisfaction with police handling of an incident the previous Thursday at Bad Lands Bar. Sgt. Neal presented a report concerning the 3rd District. Residents of that area expressed dissatisfaction with public drunkenness and loitering. One woman complained of being harrassed and fondled by loiters outside the Pena store on 17th Street. Another resident complained about the dumpster on public space at La Fonda restaurant.

A resident of 1703 Q street complained about rats, trash, and public urination and defecation. He also noted that the Dupont Szechuan maintains an open trash container which attracts rats. He has asked the health authorities to inspect it, but no improvement has resulted.

Ms. Moses moved, and Mr. Gaugler seconded a motion to approve the January 10 minutes as corrected. The motion was passed unanimously.

Ms. Moses moved, and Mr. Evans seconded, a motion to approve the January 24 minutes as corrected. The motion was passed, with all commissioners voting in favor except Mr. Grandis who abstained.

Ms. Moses moved, and Mr. Bass seconded a motion to oppose the renewal of a liquor license for Larimer's, based on numerous complaints from the community, and with the understanding that the motion was made to preserve the ANC's right to protest, but that the ANC will further consider the matter at its next meeting, when representatives of Larimers should be present. The motion was passed unanimously.

The commissioners agreed to postpone discussion of a resolution concerning Mayor Barry until the next meeting of the ANC.

Mr. Gaugler moved, and Mrs. Rieffel seconded, a motion that the ANC write to La Fonda restaurant concerning the dumpster on public space. The motion was passed unanimously.

Mr. Gaugler moved, and Ms. Moses seconded, a motion that the ANC support the application of Berose Liquor for a renewal of its

liquor license. Mr. Bass noted that he would abstain because of philosophical problems with the number of liquor licensed establishments on 17th Street. Mrs. Rieffel noted that she would abstain because she preferred that all liquor dealers on 17th Street be signatories to similar voluntary agreements. The motion was passed, with all commissioners voting in favor except Mr. Bass and Mrs. Rieffel, who abstained.

Mr. Grandis moved, and Ms. Moses seconded, a motion that the request of Le Tam Tam restaurant for a renewal of its liquor license be supported on the understanding that the establishment sign a voluntary agreement as attached. The motion was passed unanimously.

Mr. Grandis moved, and _____?_____ seconded a motion that ANC 2B invite persons to address a pro-Initiate 17 position if Councilmember Crawford's committee decides to hold hearings on the issue. The motion was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Rieffel moved and Mr. Gaugler seconded the following motion attached motion concerning Cairo Liquors. The motion was passed, with all commissioners voting in favor except Mr. Bass, who abstained.

Mr. Grandis moved, and Mr. Gaugler seconded a motion that the ANC send a letter to the police strongly encouraging the 2nd District to make a full report to the ANC concerning recent incidents at the "Badlands" and other nightspots. The motion was passed unanimously.

Mr. Evans moved and Ms. Moses seconded a motion to raise the salary of the staff coordinator by the amount of \$2.5015 an hour. The motion was passed unanimously.

Mr. Maggi moved, and Mr. Evans seconded, a motion to amend the Fy 90 budget to reflect the preceding motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m.

Motion by David Maggi, seconded by Dennis Gaugler (?):

That the ANC support the application for a [CT liquor (tavern)] license by New-Dot, Inc., for Mr. P's, provided that:

1. the applicant amend its ANC [license renewal] form to indicate:
 - (a) the hours of operation of its outside garden/patio (which are to no later than 11:00 p.m. on Sunday-Thursday (except days preceding a Federal holiday) and 12:00 midnight Friday-Saturday and days preceding a Federal holiday);
 - (b) the estimated occupancy of its outside garden/patio (which was stated to be 125);
 - (c) the time for collecting trash (which is to be between 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Monday-Saturday);
 - (d) that it will not seek a sidewalk cafe; and
 - (e) that there may be entertainment, vocals or singing, and dancing on the premises occasionally, if that is accurate.
2. the ANC and the applicant enter into an agreement, that is to be enforced by the ABC Board, providing that:
 - (1) the ANC will support the application,
 - (2) the applicant will not have music (live or taped) or other entertainment (except that cook-outs are permitted) on the outside garden/patio or other outside portion of its business,
 - (3) the applicant will post signs asking patrons not to make noise while in the area,
 - (4) the applicant will operate its business as described in the revised ANC liquor license form, which is to be attached to the agreement, and
 - (5) the applicant is to close its outdoor garden/patio no later than 11:00 p.m. on Sunday-Thursday (except days preceding a Federal holiday), and 12:00 midnight Friday-Saturday and days preceding a Federal holiday; and
3. if the applicant does not amend its ANC liquor license form and enter into such as agreement by January 16, 1990, the ANC will file a protest to the grant of the license and oppose it as strongly opposed by the residents of the area.

The motion was passed 5-0-2, with Mr. Bass and Ms. Rieffel abstaining.

Incorporates at ¶¶ 1(a) and 2(5) a motion by Dennis Bass, seconded by Alaire Reiffel to limit hours of operation to 11:00 p.m. Sunday-Thursday, except for days preceding a Federal holiday. The original motion limited hours to 12:00 midnight on all days.

The amending motion was passed unanimously.

AGREEMENT CONCERNING MR. P'S

The Parties agree to take the following actions regarding the request for a CT (tavern) retailer's liquor license for the facility known as Mr. P's at 2147 P Street, N.W.

Parties: Dupont Circle Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC 2B)
New-Dot, Inc. (license applicant)

The Dupont Circle ANC agrees to support the applicants request for a liquor license provided the applicant takes the following actions:

1. Conforms in all respects to the description of its business, known as Mr. P's, as set forth on the ANC 2B form for renewal of licenses, which is appended to this agreement.
2. Does not use live or recorded music in the garden/patio or other outside portions of its business.
3. Displays signs inside the establishment next to the doors on P Street asking patrons not to make noise in the area.
4. Will close its garden/patio at 11:00 p.m. Sunday-Thursday, and 12:00 midnight Friday-Saturday, except that it can remain open until 12:00 midnight on the day preceding a Federal holiday.
