RE: Public Space Application by the Golden Triangle BID for the Installation of a Temporary Sculpture at the Intersection of Connecticut Avenue and K Street NW (DDOT #380126)

Dear Chair Marcou:

At its regular meeting on September 9, 2021, the Dupont Circle Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC 2B” or “Commission”) considered the above-referenced matter. With 8 of 9 Commissioners in attendance, a quorum at a duly-noticed public meeting, the Commission approved the following resolution by a vote of (8-0-0):

WHEREAS, the Golden Triangle Business Improvement District (BID) seeks to install a temporary sculpture within the Connecticut Avenue NW median at the intersection of K Street NW,

WHEREAS, the sculpture will be located within ANC 2B and the Golden Triangle BID,

WHEREAS, over the past thirteen years the Golden Triangle BID has installed both permanent and temporary public artworks to enliven the sidewalks, parks, medians, and in Metrorail stations throughout the Golden Triangle neighborhood, and

WHEREAS, this project will continue the Golden Triangle BID’s legacy of public space improvements and public space activations that make the community cleaner, safer, and more vibrant.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that ANC 2B supports the Golden Triangle BID’s application and final design for a temporary sculpture to activate the Connecticut Avenue NW median at the intersection of K Street NW.
